THE BLACK AND WHITE VILLAGE TRAIL

O/S Landranger sheets 148 & 149

Short Route. This 27 mile ride passes through four villages and an airfield but only one short serious hill. There is a pleasant short cut reducing the distance to 15 miles. Good for families.

<u>Medium Route.</u> More villages and a visit to Kington on this 48 mile ride. Some hills particularly a good slog for 2 miles between Eardisley and Kington then a shorter one to Lyonshall.

Long Route. Great run down to Hay-on-Wye and then back over the Wye and over the top through Kilvert country to Kington. About 59 miles. Plenty of hills but well worth the effort.

KINGSLAND. An ancient village but still very active with school, garage, village stores and tea room and medical practice. There are two pubs and a cafe and all is ranged along the long main street with several fine properties. There is a 14th C church and a castle mound with moat reputedly built by King Merewald of Mercia.

EARDISLAND. One of the prettiest villages in Herefordshire set along the River Arrow. Children will enjoy feeding the ducks by the bridge. The 18th Century dovecote has been restored and nearby is the 14th Century yeomans dwelling, the Staick House. There are two pubs and down the lane by the church there are tea rooms with craft shop.

<u>DILWYN.</u> An attractive village with a green at its centre. There is a fine church, St. Mary's, which boasts the longest church key in the country at 43cm. The Crown Inn and the nearby Old Forge Studio and Café will supply your inner needs.

WEOBLEY. Called 'The Jewel of Herefordshire' with its multitude of timbered houses and a fine church with a tall spire which dominates the landscape. A thriving village with two schools, several shops, three inns and two restaurants. latter will

<u>DUNKERTONS CIDER CO.</u> One of the county's smaller cider makers. Call in and see how organic traditional Herefordshire cider is made and taste it - of course. There is a good restaurant on the premises.

PEMBRIDGE. Another village stuffed with timber framed buildings. The New Inn was new in the 14thC and stands next to the Market Hall. Nearby is the Red Lion Inn and down the road a 16thC. Visitor Centre with a café. Steps lead off the market square leading to the church of St Mary with its remarkable detached belfry - not to be missed. On the route leading out of the village, just over the river and left, there is a picnic area where the kids can paddle safely in the River Arrow.

SHOBDON AIRFIELD. This ex-WW2 airfield is now home to the Herefordshire Aero Club. There are light aircraft, microlights, gliders and helicopters to be 'spotted' and there is a grassy viewing area with picnic tables. In the Nissen hut by the control tower there is a café and bar where visitors are welcome

EARDISLEY. Picturesque ancient cottages flank the main Kington to Hereford road. The castle has long gone but the 12th Century church with a fine Norman font is worth a visit. In 1974 a record breaking peal of 15,000 Doubles lasting 7 hours 22 minutes was rung on the church bells. The Tram Inn is named after the horse drawn tramway that ran from Brecon to Kington until 1856.

KINGTON. One of the five market towns of Herefordshire Kington is largely unspoiled by modern intrusions. The Lady Hawkins Grammar School was founded by the wife of John Hawkins the Elizabethan sailor in 1632. Take a little time to wander down the main street and look in the shops. The toilets, museum with café, Burton Hotel, Tourist Information Centre are all in close proximity to the market hall. On nearby Bradnor Hill is the highest golf course in the country.

HAY ON WYE. Just over the Welsh border and sitting comfortably by the River Wye with the Black mountains as a backdrop Hay is an important market town. It is now best known as an international book centre attracting visitors from all over the world. There are several cafes and hostelries to choose from.
