CASTLES GALORE O/S Landranger Sheet 137

Short Route. Richards Castle, Ludlow Castle, Wigmore Castle. 28miles with steep climb out of Ludlow on return. Alternative return route.

Medium Route. Richards Castle, Ludlow, Stokesay and Wigmore. 40 moderate miles

Long Route. Add Bishops Castle and Hopton Castle, several long steady climbs and one short beastly one to make 73 miles. There are some short cuts worth 13 miles.

BERRINGTON HALL. National Trust property built in 1783 by Henry Holland for Thomas Harley. The park was laid out by Capability Brown. There is a tea room but you will have to pay an entrance fee to the grounds to access it. Group rate for Tandem 2011 for house visit.

RICHARDS CASTLE. Here there is a beautiful 14th C church with a detached tower and close by the remains of a very early Norman castle founded by Richard FitzScrob, a Norman noble who actually lived in the castle before William the Conqueror landed.

LUDLOW. Oh come you on a Monday - when Ludlow Market hums

And Ludlow bells are playing - 'The Conquering Hero comes'

So wrote A E Houseman who is interred in the churchyard. The Market is still here and the bells of St Laurence's still ring out in this fine historic town with its 500 listed buildings and medieval street layout. The 900 year old castle, built to keep the Welsh at bay, became the headquarters of the Council of the Marches and was the last Royalist fortress to fall in the Civil War.

WIGMORE. Built by the Mortimers who played a large part in our history and once one of the most powerful fortresses in the Marches. It has recently been 'restored' by English Heritage as a 'romantic ruin'.

SHROPSHIRE HILLS DISCOVERY CENTRE. Café accessible without payment.

STOKESAY CASTLE. One of the finest examples of a fortified manor house in England dating back to the 13th C. Not to be missed.

LEINTWARDINE. Formerly the Roman town of Bravonium sited at the confluence of the Teme and the Clun. The church is built on a Saxon site on top of Roman remains. Good butchers and an excellent fish and chip shop. A few doors past the chippy is the Sun Inn - a real time warp. Sadly Flossie Lane Britain's oldest landlady who some may remember, died in June 2009 at the age of 94. Her memorial is a misericords in the church.

ACTON SCOTT. Working farm museum with café. Well worth a visit.

CHURCH STRETTON. This busy little town once a 19th century health resort stands in the beautiful valley between the Long Mynd and Caer Caradoc.

MINTON. This hamlet is said by archaeologists to give a striking impression of what a Saxon settlement was like. It has a Saxon castle mound and the farmhouse and manor house encircle the village green.

BISHOPS CASTLE. Here the bishops of Hereford had a castle on land bequeathed by Egwin Shakehead who was cured of palsy at the Hereford shrine of St Ethelbert. Until 1965 it was the smallest borough in England. It is an utterly charming lazy unpretentious little market town well worth a potter round. The oldest inn, the Three Tuns, has its own Victorian tower brewery and the Six Bells by the church also brews.

HOPTON CASTLE. Given by Henry II to one of his supporters in 1165 this Norman fortress suffered more at the hands of the English than of the Welsh. In 1644 it was held for the Parliamentarians by 33 men commanded by Samuel More against a Royalist force of 5000. After a month the Roundheads surrendered and the mound became slippery with their blood as they were massacred by the Royalists.

The views are worth the effort but if you feel this is too intimidating the only practicable alternative is to retrace your route over Ludford Bridge and then follow the B4361 and B4362 via Richards Castle and Bircher with your own variations.
